# **3<sup>rd</sup> Year Rotations Available**

Onsite Rotations: IM I (Hospital Inpatient) and IM 2 (IM 2 is Cardiology/Pulmonology); Geriatrics; General Surgery; Family Medicine (Primary Care); Psychiatry.

Offsite: Clinical Primary Care (Dr. Amin's Family Practice Office) in Salisbury; Pediatrics at Clinch Valley; OB/GYN in Salisbury.

# 4<sup>th</sup> Year Rotations Available

Anesthesiology, Cardiology, Pulmonology, Nephrology, Neurology, Hematology/Oncology, PM&R, Women's Health (Gynecology), Urology, Otolaryngology, Infectious Diseases, Rheumatology, Orthopedics, Gastroenterology, and Emergency Medicine.

Note: Some rotations are limited to one student per month, so it is first come.

Possible or Limited Rotations needing approval: Hospice/Palliative Care, Radiology.

### **Residency Programs**

The VA does not have its own residencies, but rather has Affiliations with Residency Programs to teach their residents. We currently have residents from Wake Forest/Baptist Hospital, CMC in Charlotte (Carolinas Healthcare System), Bluefield Regional Medical Center, Blue Ridge Healthcare (Morganton, NC), Moses Cone Hospital, Danville Regional Medical Center (Sovah Health Care), and CMC-Northeast Hospital (Concord, NC). We have residency programs in Internal Medicine (Outpatient), Allergy/Immunology, Cardiology, Dermatology, Endocrinology, Family Medicine, Gastroenterology, Gynecology, Hematology/Oncology, Infectious Diseases, Neurology, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Pulmonology, Psychiatry, PM&R, Radiation/Oncology, Surgery (General), and Urology. We have approximately 350 total residents during the academic year.
