We look forward to improving the overall health of our community and helping people take a more proactive role in prevention. We send our best wishes for a healthy 2020.



Visiting Hours and Guidelines

However, it is important to balance the benefits of visitation with the hospital's duty to provide the most therapeutic environment possible for recovery. Clinically appropriate limitations may be placed on patient's visitation when it would interfere with the care.

- General Care areas: 9:00 a.m. 9:00 p.m.
- Intensive Care Unit: 8:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m.; 5:00 6:00 p.m.; 8:00 9:00 p.m.
- Women's LifeCare Center: 9:00 a.m. 9:00 p.m.
- Quiet Hours: 3:00 5:00 p.m. daily throughout the entire facility to allow healing for our patients.

Gift Shop

The hospital gift shop is located in the front lobby, and stocks candy, fresh flowers, greeting cards, baby items, balloons, jewelry and an assortment of other gifts. Gift wrapping is available for purchases made in the shop. The Hospital Auxiliary operates the gift shop. Proceeds fund scholarships for students who live in Aiken County and are enrolled in accredited medical education programs. Please check with the nurse before giving a patient any food or candy. Flowers are not permitted in the Intensive Care Units.
