

Hospital Information

The medical center in Orangeburg became part of the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) Health System in March 2023. Our purpose is to preserve and optimize human life in South Carolina through our vision to lead health innovation for the lives we touch.

MUSC Health is dedicated to delivering the highest-quality and safest patient care while educating and training generations of outstanding health care providers and leaders to serve the people of South Carolina and beyond. Patient care is provided at 16 hospitals with approximately 2,700 beds and four additional hospital locations in development; more than 350 telehealth sites and connectivity to patients' homes; and nearly 750 care locations situated in all regions of South Carolina.

In 2023, for the ninth consecutive year, U.S. News & World Report named MUSC Health University Medical Center in Charleston the No. 1 hospital in South Carolina.

Attendance Requirements for Lectures and Seminars

Attendance is required for third year students and encouraged for fourth years. OMM Workshops are required and students are expected to participate while on their rotations.

Site Orientation

There is a three day orientation usually conducted the last week of July prior to the first rotation beginning in August for all incoming 3rd year students (date subject to change). This includes computer training, review of rules and regulations, completing required paperwork, and receiving required name badges. Incoming students will also be required to do online modules for onboarding to MUSC.

Visiting third and fourth year students will receive information prior to start. Some orientation will be done electronically prior to the start date. The remaining orientation will be done on the first day of the rotation or earlier when possible.

Community Information

ANTIQUES - The town of Elloree is known for its many antique stores. Antiques and artifacts are also on display at the award-winning Elloree Heritage Museum and Cultural Center, the restored 1920s Springfield High School in Springfield and the Old Willow School in Norway.

GREAT OUTDOORS - Hike, bike, canoe, kayak, disk golf, bird watch, fish, picnic or simply relax in Orangeburg County's picturesque natural habitat. Take time to stop and smell the roses, azaleas and other beautiful flowers at Edisto Memorial Gardens on the North Edisto River, home to the Orangeburg Festival of Roses.

FESTIVALS - Orangeburg County is home to some of the most fun-filled festivals in the state, including the Orangeburg Festival of Roses, the Raylrode Daze Festival, the Governor's Frog Jump and International Egg Strike, the Cotton Festival, the Eutaw Village Festival, the Harvest Festival and the Holly Hill Christmas Festival.

GOLF - Orangeburg draws many golfers to the area with a variety of golfing venues. Among Orangeburg's golf options is our Orangeburg Country Club, with its 18th hole listed as the "Most Challenging Finishing Hole in the Midlands". The site was selected as one of the states two "Best Renovations/Restorations", and Top 30 "Best You Can Play". Hillcrest Recreation Center, located conveniently off the interstate, offers a public golf course with tennis courts, soccer, baseball, and softball fields. It is rated as a top municipal golf course in the Carolinas.

THEATER - Let the Orangeburg Part-Time Players entertain you at the Bluebird Theatre, which has been restored to its original splendor. Shows run quarterly.
