Hospital Information

Orange Park Medical Center is a full service, acute-care hospital with 317 inpatient beds located in the heart of Orange Park, providing medical care to Clay county and surrounding communities. The hospital has 170 private rooms. There are nine labor, delivery and recovery room suites for new mothers and a seven-bed level-2 neonatal intensive care unit for premature babies and those born with special needs. There is also a 24- bed psychiatric unit, 20-bed inpatient rehabilitation unit and 20 intensive care unit beds.
