### **3<sup>rd</sup> Year Rotations Available**

WRMC offers the required VCOM 3<sup>rd</sup> year Medical Student rotations: IMI, IMII, Family Medicine I, Family Medicine II, OB/GYN, General Surgery, Pediatrics, Geriatrics, and Psychiatry.

### **4th Year Rotations Available**

All of the following based upon availability: Anesthesiology, Cardiology, Gastroenterology, ENT, ICU, Infectious Disease, In-Patient Internal Medicine Auditions, Nephrology, Pulmonology, and Radiology.

Emergency Medicine is available only to those students who have previously completed an In-Hospital rotation and have the skills to independently navigate throughout our EMR, Cerner.

### **Available Lectures and Seminars**

Lectures Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays from 12:00 – 1:00pm. Tumor Board 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of the month 12 – 1:00pm (replaces lecture on that day).

Dedicated didactic morning – Thursdays 8:00am – 12:00, including 1 hour of Review for COMLEX 3 and IM Boards.

Skills labs twice yearly.

OMM Clinic for employees and the public, 4 times a year.

### **Attendance Requirements for Lectures and Seminars**

Attendance is mandatory. If Resident/Medical Student is on rotation which is 30 minutes or more travel distance away, they are excused from Noon Lectures. Thursday didactics is mandatory for all. Special exceptions are made on a case by case basis if an opportunity arises to experience an “out of the ordinary” case in the OR or procedure. Must notify coordinator via email.

### **Housing**

Two bedroom apartment is available for visiting VCOM medical students. Arrangements must be made through the VCOM office to determine availability.

### **Site Orientation**

Orientation takes place during the first two days of Block 1 and attendance is mandatory. There are training materials and paperwork that requires completion two weeks prior to the start of the first rotation. This allows enough time to process computer access information for Cerner training, our electronic medical record system. Additional paperwork is completed during the orientation as well as photo ID badges distributed, etc.
